Yakima County Sheriff Robert Udell gave a presentation via Zoom on the use of body cameras by law enforcement. After recent hires of additional deputies, and with the intent to increase reserve numbers, the Sheriff's Office recognized the need to purchase additional equipment for new personnel and for spares. He explained that body cameras are much more beneficial than anyone could have anticipated, in that they decrease liability, provide accurate information about both cases and complaints, decrease the number of complaints overall, and encourage citizens to be on their best behavior when interacting with law enforcement. He noted that this purchase would be covered by the Sheriff's Office contingency fund.
