



Yakima County Homeless Housing and Assistance Grants Awarded for the Grant Cycle starting July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2022

YAKIMA – The Homeless Housing and Assistance program funds, which comprise both Local 2163 revenues and State Consolidated Homeless Grant (CHG) dollars, have been awarded for the upcoming grant cycle (starting July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2022).

Grants funded by local 2163 revenues have been awarded in the following amounts:

24-Hour Low-Barrier Shelter (City of Yakima)

- Rod's House: \$46,500
- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$75,000
- Triumph Treatment Services: \$20,000

Capital Improvement

- Rod's House: \$200,000

Domestic Violence Shelter (Lower/Southern Valley)

- The Lighthouse - Advocacy, Prevention, and Education Center: \$93,330

Extreme Winter Weather Shelter

- Rod's House: \$55,000
- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$94,070
- Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic DBA Northwest Community Action Center: \$52,600

Grants funded by the base funds within the Consolidated Homeless Grant have been awarded in the following amounts:

Coordinated Entry (Adults)

- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$75,000
- Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic DBA Northwest Community Action Center: \$15,000

Coordinated Entry (Young Adults)

- Rod's House: \$15,000
- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$10,000

Domestic Violence Shelter (Upper Valley)

- YWCA: \$100,000

Outreach

- Rod's House: \$30,000
- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$58,000

Overnight Low-Barrier Shelter (Lower/Southern Valley)

- Generating Hope: \$100,000

Youth and Young Adults Shelter

- Rod's House: \$125,000

Grants funded by the Rental Assistance, Permanent Supportive Housing, and Housing and Essential Needs funds within the Consolidated Homeless Grant have been awarded in the following amounts:

Rental Assistance (All County):

- Catholic Charities Diocese of Yakima: \$134,239
- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$262,000
- Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic DBA Northwest Community Action Center: \$390,642

Rental Assistance (Veterans):

- Yakima County Veterans Program: \$16,000

Permanent Supportive Housing

- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$129,768

Housing and Essential Needs

- Yakima Neighborhood Health Services: \$706,272
- Yakima Valley Farm Workers Clinic DBA Northwest Community Action Center: \$653,798

A minimum of 67% of Rental Assistance and Permanent Supportive Housing grants must be paid directly to private landlords in the form of rent. All grants are restricted to a 6% limit for administrative costs.

Grants were awarded based on funding availability and requirements, alignment with locally identified 5-Year Plan Goals, and scores from the Yakima County Homeless Coalition's Competitive Process Scoring Committee. Further details can be found on the Yakima County
