Yakima Neighborhood Health Services is a Community Health Center offering affordable, accessible quality health care for all ages. Services include diagnosis and treatment by medical and dental professionals, prenatal care, pharmacy, nutrition services, behavioral health/counseling, WIC nutrition program, maternity support and more. Services for Homeless also include emergency resources and assistance, street outreach, recuperative respite care and transitional and permanent supportive housing.

Non-profit programs with a mission to help clients continue living independently, safely, and with dignity in the comfort of their own homes. Volunteer Chore Services (VCS) serves low-income elders and adults with disabilities. The Senior Companion Program is a no fee service for people aged 55 and older. We provide assistance and friendship to elderly adult individuals who are homebound with special needs and generally living alone. We recruit volunteers to provide companionship to homebound individuals by taking care of simple chores, providing transportation, and offering contact to the outside world.
