Total Number of Clients (both duplicated/unduplicated number):

During the first quarter of 2025, we have had a total of 56 active participants in the Yakima County Superior Court Drug Court Program and 5 successful graduations from the program. We have also received a total of 36 referrals during this time; 10 are still petitioning, 11 were accepted into the program, and 5 referrals were not able to be accepted into the program.

Narrative Summary Detailing Program Success:

The Yakima County Superior Court Drug Court Program has successfully graduated five Drug Court Participants in the last quarter. All of our graduates had regained their driver's licenses, and all five graduates were all employed at the time of graduation. One graduate was enrolled in a criminal justice program in college!

We have started experimenting with the DIMS program app with a couple of program participants. There are a number of features that we need to learn to set up before it can be rolled out to more participants.

Encountered Barriers:

We have had a continued struggle with accessing resources for funding for housing for our program participants. This is a substantial need for people coming out of residential treatment, it is a barrier to staying sober and a

barrier to staying in treatment. Without a safe, stable, drug free place to stay that allows the participants to easily access bus lines or within walking distance to treatment providers, and access to transportation, participants are unable to maintain recovery beyond a couple days out of treatment. We have seen some participants fall off track or be unable to easily find a path and have become overwhelmed at the outset causing poor outcomes for these participants.

Significant Changes to the Program:
