Define a "successful exit" for the project/program Successful completion of the program requires all five phases to be completed, the basic program requirements must be achieved unless waived due to extenuating circumstances. Participants must be working full time for a minimum of 6 months and verified through random drug testing that there is a minimum of 6 months with no evidence of substance use. Graduates must have paid off their restitution, and Drug Court Fee, completed their GED if they did not have one, and obtained their drivers license if possible during their time in the program.

Provide method for tracking recidivism, including duration of time after exit. Annually, I search each participants name that exited the program within the last three years. I search to see if there is any new criminal charges, if there are, I add it to my document sheet. The number of people that were convicted of new felonies were divided by the total number of participants that exited the program in the respective manner.

I have emailed the recidivism rates to Melisa Holm in a spread sheet. Our success rate is well above the national average. The national average is estimated to be 60%, and Yakima County is coming in at approximately 72%. Goals for 2026 are:

To track long term recovery data, not just the recidivism data.

To make sure participants are still connected to doctors after Drug Court so that we are reducing unnecessary burdens on Emergency Rooms and overuse of Medicaid Dollars.

To connect people to life saving medication assisted treatment and SUD Counseling should they start to struggle after their graduation.

To reduce overdose death by early intervention and continued support after graduation.
